

Treehouse Programs and Eligibility

Program	Eligibility	Referral Process
Treehouse Store	Youth must be in shelter care or a legal dependent of either DCYF, federal foster care, or a tribal foster care system. Youth must also be placed in and have their case based out of Washington State	Youth may be referred by their social worker, school counselor, or CASA at www.treehouseforkids.org/our-services/make-a-referral
Just In Time Funding	Youth must be in shelter care or a legal dependent of either DCYF, federal foster care, or a tribal foster care system. Youth must also be placed in and have their case based out of Washington State	Youth may be referred by their social worker, school counselor, or CASA at www.treehouseforkids.org/our-services/make-a-referral
Drivers Assistance	Youth must be between the ages of 15 and 21, be legally dependent in Washington State or tribal foster care, and have their case based out of Washington.	Caregivers and youth may make a request online and Treehouse will verify eligibility with DCYF or a Tribe Specific ICW Director.
Holiday Magic	Youth must be legally dependent in state or tribal foster care and be in an out of home placement.	Treehouse receives a list of eligible youth from DCYF and Washington tribes and reaches out to caregivers with registration information.
Education Advocacy	Youth must be in shelter care or a legal dependent of either DCYF, federal foster care, or a tribal foster care system. There must be an immediate need that requires intervention. Youth must also be placed in and have their case based out of Washington State	Youth may be referred by their social worker, school counselor, or CASA at www.treehouseforkids.org/our-services/make-a-referral
Graduation Success	Youth must be in shelter care or a legal dependent of either DCYF, federal foster care, or one of the tribal foster care systems. Their case must be based out of Washington State. Youth must be in grades 8-12 and attending a school in Washington State.	Youth may be referred by their social worker, school counselor, or CASA at www.treehouseforkids.org/our-services/make-a-referral
Launch Success	Youth must be an alumni of Treehouse's Graduation Success program.	Youth are voluntarily enrolled upon completion of Grad Success. Youth who don't join immediately upon graduation may reach out to Treehouse to re-engage.
